Her chamber works have had multiple performances by the Boston Chamber Music Society in the United States and by several groups in France, Germany, and Russia. At the New England Conservatory, Julia studies composition with Rodney Lister, and piano with Sergey Schepkin. She lives in Wellesley, Massachusetts, with her parents and her younger sister, Lizzie.
