School, College and Career Plans Wenyi graduated second out of 683 students at Naperville Central High School. She will begin classes this fall at Harvard University in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Davidson Fellows Submission (*Technology*)
For the past 20 to 30 years, automotive engineers have played a game of guess and check with the design of the gasoline

engine, because the structure of the gasoline spray could not be accurately determined by conventional optical or laser methods. In her project, *Quantitative Analysis of Highly Transient Gasoline Sprays by Time-Resolved Synchroton X-Radiography*, Wenyi used x-rays to determine the characteristics of the spray and revealed never-before-seen irregularities crucial to drastic fuel conservation and emission control. Her findings may have significant influence on gasoline direct-injection technology and the entire automobile industry.

Biography

A recent graduate of Naperville Central High School, Wenyi was an officer on the Northeast District Illinois Student Councils Executive Board, editor of the nationally-acclaimed school newspaper, captain of the badminton team, a mock attorney and judge in Youth & Government and a member of the Math Team who won individual and team awards at the conference, regional and state levels.

Wenyi's research on gasoline-fuel sprays placed her as a finalist in the Intel Science Talent Search and regional finalist in the Siemens Westinghouse Science & Technology Competition. Her work has been published at several international conferences and has recently been submitted to Nature magazine with Wenyi as its first author. In addition to her scientific interests, Wenyi has a passion for journalism, politics and law.
