In his project titled "Development of an Advanced Bayesian Statistical Spam Filter," Jerry Guo created a program to reduce unwanted e-mail or spam. Tackling one of today's biggest problems in the growing e-world, Jerry took a novel approach to spam filtering using an advanced Bayesian statistical method to develop a more robust, adaptive and accurate filter. Jerry's anti-spam program is more than 99 percent effective, far exceeding current systems which are not only inaccurate, but also delete legitimate e-mail in the process.

Biography

Despite moving to new communities and schools several times, Jerry is first in his class of 350 students and was the only sophomore allowed to take Advanced Placement classes, including Statistics and Computer Science, which partly motivated his research. He also independently studied many science courses, including psychology, environmental science, and economics.

Not only is Jerry president of the South Carolina Jr. Academy of Science, he earned perfect exam scores on his SAT II in molecular biology, math, and writing. Having played the violin for 13 years, Jerry is the concertmaster of Canton Youth Symphony, Canton Youth Chamber Orchestra, and the Carolina Youth Chamber Orchestra. He is also the founder and principal violin of the Canton City Quartet and the associate principal first violin of the Carolina Youth Symphony. In addition, Jerry is an intern at the North Carolina Symphony.

Jerry has played on two Conference Championship teams in varsity tennis and basketball. As an individual, Jerry placed in the Top Ten at the Chess State Championship. He also played a supporting role in the school play *Tom Sawyer*.
