In her portfolio titled "Heaven Breaking In On Us," Molly Carr exhibits why she is a nationally recognized violist. She plays a variety of pieces for viola chosen from different composers, including Bach and Brahms. Molly's goal when performing is to become a "link" between the composer and her listeners. She researches the lives, times and musical styles of each composer prior to performing their work. Representing a new generation of string players, Molly shares the beauty and grace of the viola with the world.

Biography

At the age of 14, Molly became the youngest musician ever to win a contract position with the Reno Philharmonic Orchestra, with which she performs regularly. Although Molly attended a private school for her freshman year in high school, her practice schedule was best accommodated by homeschooling.

Her rigorous practice and passion for music fueled her desire to build her solo repertoire with meaningful and unique performances.

Molly's recent performances include Carnegie Hall with the New York String Orchestra; PBS's *Live from Lincoln Center*; CBS's *Kennedy Center Honors Awards* with Itzhak Perlman, Pinchas Zukerman and fellow students of the Perlman Music Program; National Public Radio's *From The Top* with Christopher O'Riley; and the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., with the Washington Chamber Symphony's 2002 *Viva Vivaldi! All Girl Orchestra*.

During the summers, Molly has attended the Innsbrook Music Festival, California Summer Music, Chamber Music Wyoming, and various Master Classes.
