Davidson Fellows Submission (Music: Classical Instrumentalist)

The project "Performance Selections for Piano" is Marc's way of carrying on the tradition of the virtuoso. For him, this means performing music of the highest degree of technique through complete dedication. Marc has been studying piano and cello since the age of 3, and currently attends the Colburn School of Performing Arts in Los Angeles. At the age of 5, Marc passed the California Certificate of Merit piano and cello exams and was the winner at the National Piano Guild Audition two years in a row. At the 2004 Southwest Youth Music Festival, he won first place in cello and second place in piano. In 2005, he was the youngest participant in the Virginia Waring International Piano Competition master classes.

Biography

When he was 3, Marc realized he was thinking about music more than anyone else his age. Because he could concentrate and hear the logic behind the music, he excelled. After only studying the piano for two and a half years and the cello for two, he has won numerous competitions and participated in master classes and music camps.

When he is not playing music, Marc loves chess and Scrabble, reading books, studying math and enjoying art. He works to improve his piano and cello abilities every day by practicing, improvising and/or composing. His favorite activity is playing music for an audience.

The Virginia Waring International Piano Competition is a world-class event for young pianists that takes place every four years. Marc was selected to perform at the piano master class of this prestigious competition in January 2005 for Dr. Robert Roux. In July 2005, Marc made his orchestral debut with the Capistrano Valley Symphony, playing a piano concerto, Bach, and a cello concerto, Vivaldi.
