In her portfolio, "Music as Universal Communication," Heather views music as a method of communication and a tool for social progress. Heather's portfolio is a collection of vocal pieces showcasing her range from musical theater to operatic arias, highlighting both the intricacy of language and the temporal aspects of music. She earned first place in the Regional National Association of Teachers of Singing, the Mississippi Symphony Young Artist's Competition, the PRIDE Talent Search and Vanderbilt University's Blair School of Music scholarship. Heather played the violin in appearances on NPR's "From the Top" and with the Interlochen Intermediate Divisional Symphony Orchestra.

Biography

Heather's passion for drama began at Central Elementary School, the setting of her first three years of schooling. Here she became engulfed in the school's musical theater program, and her love of the violin and singing took off from there.

A 2000 title role in *Amahl and the Night Visitors* with the Tuscaloosa Symphony Orchestra led to a series of noteworthy performances. Heather appeared on "The Steve and DC Morning Show" in 2001 as a vocalist. She also performed during OperAlaBama 2006: The Queen of the Night in Mozart's *Magic Flute*. Heather has appeared in vocal and violin recitals throughout the Southeast.

Heather has put her astute ability to use as a teacher as well. In 2002, at the age of 12, she began giving private violin studio lessons. She has also spent time as a violin instructor at Oakdale Primary School.
