Todd is an honors graduate of The Juilliard School Pre-College Division and the Earl L. Vandermeulen High School. He will attend Princeton University where he plans to study music and economics. Although his career goals are not yet defined, Todd

sees music composition and cello performance as an important part of his future plans.

Davidson Fellows Submission (Music)

In his portfolio, "Finding My Voice Through Music," Todd traces his development as a composer from age 12. Todd believes every period in history needs new composers and performers to develop artistic traditions that evolve with the times. Todd recently graduated from The Juilliard Pre-College Division and is a student at The Perlman Music Program. In addition to being a composer, Todd is a cellist and has performed at Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center and has appeared on NPR's "From the Top."

Biography

Todd began playing the cello at 4, entered The Juilliard School Pre-College Division at 8, and began composing at 10. He comes from a musical family, having two older brothers who also studied at Juilliard and The Perlman Music Program. Todd's composition portfolio includes a suite for violin and cello, a cello sonata, a string quartet, and a rhapsody for French horn and piano.

Todd's greatest challenge as a composer has been the development of a unique musical style. Although he learned music theory with relative ease, it was difficult to gain the depth of understanding of musical language necessary to express himself as he hoped. He worked hard to become familiar with a wide range of musical styles and was guided by his mentor, Eric Ewazen, and many other inspiring and supportive teachers on the way towards developing his own voice.

Todd hopes the music he writes can provide a meaningful artistic contribution. He feels it is especially important to compose for instruments that are only now beginning to gain prominence as solo instruments.
