In his project, "The Ontology of Science: A Critical Perspective," Michael tackles one of the largest philosophical debates of our time – the role of science in society. In his

portfolio, Michael examines this relationship by synthesizing and applying several complex philosophical concepts to basic questions about science in everyday life. With a unifying thesis that conventional views of science, truth, and nature only function from a self-referential viewpoint, he presents new, transversal perspectives in hopes that this critical examination will lead to a greater understanding of the world at large.

Biography

Michael attended Montessori School through sixth grade and enjoyed the flexible class schedule and emphasis on interest-based learning and working at his own pace. He is a strong advocate for a desire driven education that allows students to experience life.

Michael has always been interested in philosophy although most that captured his attention were very abstract. He was prompted to do his Fellows project as a result of various discussions with his debate coach and mentor. As he began to reconsider the few very basic ways he viewed the world and began to reconsider what it meant to view the world, it became clear that a great many social conventions and common beliefs fell into a new and uncomfortable light. He was moved to investigate further, in order to see what kinds of rigid rationality were acceptable and useful, and which kinds were not.

Michael's main hobbies/interests include: sitting outside and hanging out with big groups of friends, writing poetry, and attending debate tournaments. His favorite kinds of music are rap (Mid West, Dirty South, East Coast, West Coast, old school, and progressive hip hop), really traditional punk music, really weird alternative music, old school industrial, reggae and dancehall, as well as blues, bluegrass, and traditional country.
