In her harp portfolio, "Harping Around the World: Cultural Leadership for the 21st Century," Melody draws on her

experience as a harpist to connect with audiences. She is particularly interested in inspiring young people to discover and pursue their own passion for classical music. Melody has performed on and serves as a Cultural Ambassador for NPR's "From the Top" and was a Focus on Youth Performer for the ninth and 10th World Harp Congresses.

Biography

When Melody was 4 years old, she sat on a high stool, plucked the strings of a 96 lb. concert harp and promptly fell backwards, leaving a sizeable dent in the drywall behind her. Shortly thereafter, she began harp studies as the youngest harp student at Indiana University School of Music.

Since moving to Hawaii eight years ago, Melody has studied with the Principal Harpist of the Honolulu Symphony. After thirteen years of study, Melody still loves playing the harp and shares this passion through live performances, including recitals at the World Harp Congresses in Dublin and Amsterdam.

As founding member and past president of her school's Astronomy Club, Melody attended the HI-Star Astronomy Camp funded by NASA and the University of Arizona's Senior Astronomy Camp. She also attended the Economics for Leaders program at the University of Texas/Austin.

During her senior year, Melody took six Advanced Placement classes. She tutored other students in subjects including economics, mathematics and world history.

Melody has numerous other interests, including digging for fossils at Fossil Butte, rowing a raft across Red Fleet reservoir to view hadrosaur tracks, exploring the universe with astronomers, introducing classical music to homeless children, competing in Soroban (Japanese math abacus), making monkey bread, and learning karate moves.
