A rising senior at Horace Greeley High School, Merry plans to major in biology and would like to pursue a career in science.

Davidson Fellows Submission (Science)

In her project, "Fighting Cancer with Sound: Activation of an Immune Response Against Tumor Cells Using Therapeutic Ultrasound," Merry studied therapeutic ultrasound's potential in treating recurrent and metastatic cancers. Traditional therapies like radiation,

chemotherapy, and surgical resection are ineffective in immune responses against tumor cells. Merry found that therapeutic ultrasound causes stress and light damage to tumor cells, which alerts the immune system to respond and target the tumor. Her results demonstrate the possibility of a novel, non-invasive, non-toxic cancer therapy that treats solid tumors as well as systemic metastases.

Biography

Merry attended Montessori School which allowed her to go directly to second grade. Starting in 4th grade, she participated in Horizons, her township's gifted and talented program. Horizons grouped the 4th-6th grade students together and followed a curriculum focused on self-guided learning through explorations including the dissection of a shark at age 7.

Merry's interest in cancer began when several family members and friends were diagnosed with the disease several years ago, and two of her best friends' mothers died of it. She observed the effects of the disease itself as well as the often-toxic side effects of the traditional treatments. Merry had unwavering support from her family and mentors while conducting her research. One obstacle she overcame was the pure scope of her project; she was extremely cramped for time due to her project's magnitude. Merry learned the valuable lesson of strategizing her time to complete her project and handle her high school course work.

Merry has played the classical piano for the past 11 years and recently played a concert at Carnegie Hall. She is also the copy editor of her school's magazine, Advo. Additionally, Merry is a member of the Academic Challenge Team and is a peer tutor for her school's tutoring service.
