Davidson Fellows Submission: Music

In his project, "The Second Silk Road: Bridging East and West Through Chinese Music," Reylon created a yangqin, or Chinese

hammered dulcimer, portfolio that has contributed to the preservation of Chinese music, to the introduction of Chinese music to people in the United States, and to the overall interconnection of the music world. His work attempts to take people past the conventional shapes and forms of Western music, helping them appreciate the universality of art. He hopes that such crosscultural music will build a deeper connection between the East and West, and inspire people to love all music.

Biography

The inspiration for Reylon's project comes mainly from his background – he is biracial and attended the bilingual Chinese-American International School through eighth grade. Having grown up in a bilingual/bicultural environment, the notion of bridging the cultures of East and West has been ingrained in Reylon, and he has experienced firsthand how cross-cultural relationships can be beneficial.

Reylon began playing the yangqin when he was eight years old, and has completed the bulk of his study at the Chinese Arts and Music Center in San Francisco. He also studied with world-renowned yangqin master Professor He Huang at the Beijing Central Conservatory of Music in the summers of 2010 and 2011. He enjoys performing this little-known instrument at various local venues, as well as participating in Chinese music competitions held annually in San Jose.

In addition to his interest in Chinese music, Reylon is interested in other aspects of Chinese culture, such as *wushu* (Chinese martial arts). He also enjoys competitive mathematics, is captain of his school's badminton team, and is the incoming Student Body President, having served on student council for the past three years. Reylon is involved with acting and comedy, and reserves time on Mondays to reenact Saturday Night Live skits with his friends.
